- It removes the onus from supervisors to fulfill their legal and moral obligations thus leaving them (and their employer) exposed to legal liability.
- 2. It creates a culture of fear and / or hiding behaviours. "Put your hard hat on...the safety guy's here!"
- 3. It nullifies the Internal Responsibility System where EVERYONE is responsible and accountable for safety outcomes.

The same things that cause safety issues cause quality and production issues. Just like everyone's responsible for quality, everyone must be responsible for safety.
